NVAC/OWN:

- NVAC met in early Feb. for 1.5 day. One day was spent on HPV. Dr. Saslow presented. Presentations on line: <https://www.hhs.gov/nvpo/nvac/meetings/2018/02-07/index.html> .
- NVAC will be meeting and releasing a [paper on recommendations](#) in early June. Committee was challenged to answer four questions about strengthening HPV work in states and systems. The charge was to: *establish a working group that will produce a brief report by June 2018 on recommendations to “strengthen the effectiveness of national, state and local efforts to improve HPV vaccination coverage rates.” HHS asks you to specifically consider: Many national organizations are currently supporting HPV efforts. Are there additional national organizations that might contribute to increasing HPV vaccination coverage? At the state level, many states have formed coalitions to support HPV vaccination efforts. Is there general guidance for states that do not yet have coalitions? Integrated healthcare delivery networks can successfully integrate comprehensive quality improvement approaches to increase vaccination coverage rates. How can state immunization programs and coalitions engage with health systems to work together on improving HPV vaccination coverage? Please specify recommendations on how to meet the needs of providers in rural areas?*

IOWA: K. Oliver and N. Brewer came to Iowa to present. Working with health care providers on QI around HPV, and had them join in AFIX and VFC visits.

CA: Had 3 HPV RT Steering Committee calls. Making decisions about membership now. Haven't looked at state RT doc yet! Can refer to our new guide. Considering what other states have done/ learned. Going to Houston in Aug. for comp cancer HPV meetings.

AL: Dr. Wharton came to visit and met with health systems and insurers in Montgomery and Birmingham. ACS staff putting together summary of visit. Looking to make health systems changes.

AIM: [Call to Action Webinars](#): Hosting a webinar tomorrow on Rural HPV Vax: featuring the Intermountain Coalition.

TX: Working on an evaluation of TX HPV Coalition. Looking to pull out best practices (NOTE: [now available online](#)). Will be presenting at NIC immunization conference.

AAP: Halfway thru ECHO learning collaborative. Funded 2 chapters for HPV hackathons this summer. This is a creative way to find a new innovative solution to a problem. Structure of event: AM: didactic background info. PM: group solutioning around chapter priorities. Day two: judging panel on best idea. Some funding available for this/best ideas.

ACS: 2 multistate HPV team trainings in partnership with Comp Cancer Coalition Nat. Program. Will train leaders from 22 states (11 states in 2 groups). Team members include ACS staff member, Immunization staffer, Comp Cancer staffer, and a SME=team of 4. Marcie can share list with group going to training.

NAOAHEC: National AHEC just did an oropharyngeal cancer webinar yesterday and it will be available through [archive](#). We also featured some new AAP handouts that are excellent!

NIC May 2018 Conference: will showcase some of the partners on this call.

### III. Review of 2018 Workplan (see slides)

- The group reviewed the workplan compiled from input in Dallas last November and Atlanta in February at the national meeting and discussed whether there were any missing components. It was noted that we should also capture what didn't work for states and document lessons learned.
- The group discussed whether any new opportunities emerged since we last met. Technical assistance will be offered through the Comp Cancer Nat. Partners. We need to keep communication open and flowing. We can also add new elements to the [Online Guide](#) as needed.
- When the group was asked by poll to indicate their satisfaction with the project workplan overall, members still on the call indicated high levels of satisfaction. 7 out of 8 members scored their satisfaction as an 8 on a scale of 1-10, and one member scored a 9 out of 10. This quick poll indicates that members are solidly in agreement on the direction of the work of the task group.
