HPV Vaccination Starting at Age 9 – Evidence Base

- We produced the HVI Special Issue Collection of over 20 articles that show the benefits, effectiveness, and acceptability of routinely recommending HPV vaccination for all adolescents starting at age nine.

- To date, collective views of the articles total more than 30,000.
- Created and promoted video abstracts from authors of the collection featured on the ACS HPVRT YouTube Channel with over 1,500 views.
- In 2022 we produced and released the "HPV Vaccinations: 9 Benefits of Starting at Age 9" motion graphic video. In one year since its upload, the video has received 26,145 views.

- Age 9 was included as the topic of discussion on the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) on Call Podcast in October 2023 with over 6,000 downloads within one month of being released.



Health Plan/Payor Summit

Injecting HPV Best Practices for Greater Reach among Healthcare Plans

Twenty health plans, ACS staff, AIM, Merck, HPV SMEs, and HPV cancer survivors/caregivers from across the country came together on August 29–30 to catalyze action for quality improvement on adolescent HPV vaccination. Held in Indianapolis, this event brought together 55 internal and external experts and convening participants often viewed as competitors. During the Summit, we:

- Amplified strategies around HPV vaccination starting at age 9
- Established best and promising practices around member engagement (reminders, incentives, education and social/digital media efforts)
- Proposed solutions to provider engagement (incentives, education/training and recognition)





2023 National Meeting

The National Islands - Vaccination & Elimination Islands

In October 2023, in Atlanta GA, we joined forces with the National Roundtable on Cervical Cancer to host our National Meeting. We convened 172 attendees from 110 different member organizations. Meeting sessions were focused on ACS Roundtable Priorities, Health Equity, Self-Collection, Starting HPV Vaccination at Age 9, Member Organization Engagement, hearing from HPV-Related cancer survivors with lived experience, and Eliminating HPV-Related Cancers Starting with Cervical Cancer.


Over two days, we workshopped ways to collaborate on best and promising practices, centering around health equity, and understanding the most updated data and innovations to propel the work of the Roundtables. We also left activated around our commitment to eliminating HPV-related cancers, starting with cervical cancer, as a public health problem.





HPV Vaccination Roundtable of the Southeast

Representatives of southeastern states (Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia) and Puerto Rico — where the rate of HPV vaccination coverage has historically been the lowest — united with St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, the American Cancer Society and the National HPV Vaccination Roundtable to discuss improving HPV vaccination.





By coming together, the southeastern roundtable continues to focus on:

- Current conditions surrounding HPV vaccination and HPV cancer prevention
- Replicating HPV vaccination success stories across the Southeast
- Overcoming challenges facing HPV vaccination
- Opportunities to improve HPV vaccination coverage in each state and the overall region

In 2023, the HPV Vaccination Roundtable of the Southeast convened six virtual events with over 1,000 attendees over multiple regional events to improve HPV vaccination uptake and propel vaccination coverage in the Southeast region. Forums and Webinars

We hosted a 3-part webinar series titled *Catalyzing Your Communication: HPV Communications Moving Forward* that had over 750 participants. Three forum sessions discussed:

- HPV Communications Moving Forward
- A Deeper Dive into HPV Communications What's Working?
- HPV Communications Evaluating Your Impact

On November 9th, we facilitated a webinar – **HPV Vaccination**, **Age 9 – From Research to Implementation** – with the Association of Immunization Managers (AIM). During the webinar, we were joined by 389 attendees who joined us as we:

- Explored new evidence on the impact of HPV vaccination at age 9
- Learned from case studies of age 9 success within health departments and healthcare organizations
- And discussed best practices for the implementation of age 9 activities



Dissemination of HPV Vaccination Findings

The National HPV Vaccination Roundtable, presented at the **35th International Papillomavirus Conference** in late April in Washington, D.C. The ACS HPV Roundtable's Tina Turpin, director, and Liddy Hora, program manager, presented a poster on getting HPV vaccination back on track post pandemic, while Dr. Debbie Saslow presented one on creating an evidence base for vaccination at age 9.



Early Career Development Program

The National HPV Vaccination Roundtable **Emerging Leaders Program** is a cohort of early-career professionals within their respective organizations. The program provided opportunities for fellows to elevate their expertise and skills in HPV vaccination and cancer prevention. Ten highly qualified candidates were selected for 2023 Emerging Leaders development and mentoring program with the HPV Roundtable. They have met bi-monthly for workshop sessions with invited facilitators throughout the fellowship year, received mentorship from Roundtable leadership, attended 2023 National Meeting events, and developed case studies on HPV vaccination disparities.







New ACS HPVRT Members

In 2023, we welcomed **eight new organizations**. We are excited about these organizations joining our efforts to work together so we can move towards ending vaccine-preventable HPV cancers as a public health problem.

2024 Priorities

Disseminate Best and Promising Practices

- Facilitate discussions concerning HPV vaccination data sources
- Collaborate with the Evidence Based Cancer Control Programs (EBCCP, formerly RTIPs) and Community Guide concerning updates
- HPV Vaccination Starting at Age 9
 - Continue to promote and expand the evidence around the impact of vaccinating starting at age 9 using research included in the HVI Special Issue Collection
 - Develop Age 9 resources for key audiences (i.e. Health Plan, Health Systems and Health Departments)
 - Highlight success stories of Age 9 HPV Vaccination Champions
 - Develop social media content on Age 9 evidence
 - Evaluate the impact of the Age 9 Campaign
- Update the Advancing Human Papillomavirus Vaccine Delivery: 12 Priority Research Gaps publication.
- Utilize communication channels to share resources, emphasize best practices and increase collaboration among member organizations.
