As a Champion Corps volunteer we need you to:



Educate 100 primary care clinical peers on cancer early detection by March 31st.



Advocate for implementation of early detection guidelines in your health system.



Deliver community, state, and national presentations to peer primary care clinicians.



Present to state professional societies like AAFP, PCA and Roundtables.

We will come together monthly September 2025 through March 2026 for engagement between American Cancer Society subject matter experts and your peer primary care champions. During each session we will discuss barriers and strategies to educating clinical peers on specific early detection focus areas and highlight educational resources.
